Dear Doctor

The following items are required in the pre-surgical evaluation of my patient.

A history should be taken for medications that may cause coagulation problems

such as aspirin, ibuprofen, vitamin E, glyceral gluconate, periactin e.t.c

- 1. After all lab work has been completed it is mandatory to perform a complete history and physical examination. If it is your conclusion that there is no contraindication to surgery, it is necessary to prepare a letter stating this assessment in writing. This report must be received by my office prior to the scheduled surgery date and be available on the day of surgery in order for my anesthesiologist to review it prior to induction of anesthesia.
- 2. Any feeling you have regarding the patients emotional status and/or maturity level would be greatly appreciated. Just as I do not operate on a patient who is medically unfit, I do not operate on a patient who has unreasonable surgical expectations. Some patients seeking plastic surgery are not good psychological candidates. If you discover in your medical evaluation that the patient seems inappropriate in any way or that there may be a psychological contraindication to surgery, please inform me immediately.
